

Downloadable resources for faith-based environmental action





The Hidden Forest	Hidden Forest (story version) (2013) Jahnavi Harrison	Entertaining and informative story written with secondary school children in mind about three generations of Hindu women making a sacred pilgrimage. Their experiences on the way shows up the contradiction between the reverence shown to Hindu deities and the disrespectful exploitation of nature that even pilgrims can be part of, but they also rediscover traditional ways of pilgrimage that can contribute to cleaning up sacred sites and the world beyond. While essentially written for a small, mostly (or all) female cast, the dramatised version has plenty of scope for building a multi-dimensional performance, including dance/movement, singing and music, that could involve many more students.
